### **New Junior Professorship**

We are proud to announce that CARMAH member Magdalena Buchczyk has been appointed to a W1 Junior Professorship in Anthropology and Cultural Expression.

As part of the junior professorship, Magdalena wishes to make a methodological and theoretical contribution to anthropology through an interdisciplinary study of cultural expressions in (1) collections, through the study of material culture and museum and heritage ethnography and (2) anthropological research on knowledge production.

Her research and teaching programme will be embedded in the Institute of European Ethnology, in particular its Centre for Anthropological Research on Museums and Heritage (CARMAH) and the Hermann von Helmholtz-Zentrum für Kulturtechnik (HZK).

Magdalena aims to develop an interdisciplinary, practiceoriented research on cultural expressions as practices of generating, transmitting and processing knowledge. She hopes to develop a research space to work with multiple stakeholders in and out of academia ranging from scientists, members of source communities to activists and artists, to produce new avenues into cultural expression research.

Magdalenda holds a PhD in Anthropology from Goldsmiths College, University of London. In the past, she was a Senior Research Associate at the Centre for Knowledge, Culture and Society, University of Bristol, and an Alexander von Humboldt Postdoctoral Fellow. Currently, she is writing a book, entitled 'Weaving Europe, Crafting the Museum' to be published with Bloomsbury Academic.
